<u>Unfinished Business</u> - We got confirmation that there is outdoor space for gym across the street in the annex as well as a multi-purpose room that can be used when the weather is cold or rainy.

A parent asked about which children have access to laptops. We were informed that all children have equal access to laptops and iPads. There is \$35K in the participatory budget for tech upgrades for the school. The Sanford

Harmony program has been very successful and will continue for the next school year.

June 13th SLT meeting notes

<u>CEP- Comprehensive Educational Plan -</u> There was a "think tank" assembled on June 7th to develop the 2018-2019 CEP. A preliminary version of the plan is due on June 28th.

<u>Managing Internet Access for Parents -</u> A parent voiced concerns about their child's access to inappropriate content online and asked if the school had any recommendations. Mrs. Migliano is going to contact Ms. Phillips about setting up a workshop in September to teach parents how to block content and limit their children's access to unwanted material.

<u>Unfinished Business - PS 196 has 1,016 students enrolled for the 2018-2019 school year</u>. This is the time to start reaching out to the DOE and to the police precinct to voice our concerns about only having one security guard in our school. It is recommended that we reach out to Alvis Brown at the DOE and Jay Findling at the precinct to start requesting a second security guard for our school and having our voices heard.
