Treasurer's Report

Proposed budget to be voted on at June meeting Anyone have idea for fundraisers/events let us know

<u>SLT-Amendment of By-laws-</u>Revised SLT By-laws were presented to the SLT for review. "Length of Term and Term limits" now includes specific language referring to the Chancellor's Regulations regarding two (2) year terms and with the one exception being the PA seat on the committee. The other item includes specific language addressing the rules on non-member participation during the meetings and the use of Executive Session. Final draft to be reviewed during next SLT meeting.

CEP (Comprehensive Educational Plan)-Mrs. Migliano spoke about the new CEP requirements. Including the use of the term "Areas of Concentration" versus goals as was used the past. The regulations now require separate ELA, Math and Supportive Environment areas of concentration. There can be sub-areas of concentration under the primary items. The first draft is due on June 28th. SLT will review at next meeting.

Garden Fence-Mr. King will examine damage and resolve. Update at next SLT meeting.

Left-handed instruments in the Music Room-Mrs. Migliano will discuss options with Ms. Lee. Update at next SLT meeting.

<u>Lunch Surveys-Survey</u> results based on student feedback from first week of the regular menu being served. Alyssa Pollack reviewed and presented results to the committee. Overall, 76% of responses were in favor of the Regular lunch menu. Mr. King discussed his findings from monitoring lunchroom waste and discussions with the lunchroom staff. The number of trash bags being filled daily seemed unchanged. However, more students were taking lunch which could account for the consistency of the trash bag usage. The question arose as to whether or not the positive feedback on the regular lunch was a function of the novelty of it. Mr. King will continue to monitor the lunchroom to see if the results change. Further discussions regarding the regular and alternative menus will take place at the next SLT meeting. Mrs. Migliano would like more time to review the research on chocolate milk and its potential benefits and health risks.
